## GENERAL SHOW REGULATIONS

This show is governed by the standard rules, regulations, and guidelines of the American Rose Society (ARS). Specific rules for Division I - Horticulture, and Division II - Rose Arrangements, precede respective class descriptions.

1. Entries are accepted from $7: 30$ to 10:00 A.M., Sunday, May 27, 2007 at the Shilo Inn. Those received after 10:00 A.M. will be for display only. The Placement Committee will place all entries, except Challenge Classes and Rose Arrangements, which are placed by the exhibitor. Only assigned persons will be allowed in the exhibit room between 10:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. No exhibits or awards may be removed before 6:00 P.M., without the permission of the Show Chair. All awards must be checked out to the winner (or representative) by the Awards Committee at 6:00 P.M. Entries not removed by 6:05 P.M. become property of the Tri-City Rose Society.
2. Competition is open to all rose growers regardless of residence. Exhibitors entering in "Junior" classes must be age 17 and under, exhibit roses from rose bushes they have cared for, and must prepare the exhibit. Exceptions are noted in the schedule for Junior Arrangements, Division II, Section M.
3. Entry tags and containers, except as noted in the schedule, will be provided by the TriCity Rose Society. All entries must be accompanied by an entry tag filled out with Section, Class, Variety Name, and Exhibitor's Name and Address, folded with name concealed, and attached to the container, or placed on the table in front of the Challenge or Rose Arrangement Class exhibit. Failure to do so will disqualify the exhibit.
4. Rose varieties must be exhibited by the ARS-approved exhibition name as listed in the current "Modern Roses," "Official List of Approved Exhibition Names," "Handbook for Selecting Roses," "American Rose" magazine, or ARS Website registrations, and classified in accordance with these publications or the current "Combined Rose List."
5. First, second, third, and fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each class where warranted. ARS certificates and awards, and Tri-City Rose Society trophies, awards, and prizes will be awarded to the highest scoring first place winners. Awards are listed with their respective class and cannot be transferred. An asterisk(*) preceding the trophy name indicates it will be retired when one person has won it three (3) times, not necessarily consecutively. A prize is meant to be kept by the winner. The judges' decision will be final. A committee consisting of the Show Chair, Judges Chair, and Schedule Chair has final procedural authority.
6. The Tri-City Rose Society, its officers and committee members will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any person or property.

## DIVISION I - HORTICULTURE RULES

1. All horticulture entries must have been grown by the exhibitor in his own private outdoor garden.
2. This is an Alphabetical Show. All roses in horticulture classes, excluding Challenge Classes, will be alphabetically arranged and judged. Each named variety is grouped as a subclass and the variety will be judged on its own merits, even though only one rose of a variety might be entered. Multiple ribbons (i.e., multiple blues, reds, yellows, and whites) may be awarded to each variety as warranted.
3. All parties from the same garden (except for Junior entries) MUST enter as ONE exhibitor on all entry tags. Examples: John Smith, or Jane Smith, or The Smiths, or John and Jane Smith.
4. Multiple entries of the same variety will be allowed from the same garden in all horticulture classes, excluding Challenge Classes.
5. One-bloom-per-stem specimens must be naturally-grown with no sidebuds or be disbudded. Specimens other than one-bloom-per-stem should be shown as naturallygrown, but an exhibitor may remove unwanted growth subject to possible penalization.
6. Only clear plastic wrap or plant material is permitted to support specimen stems, but is not to extend above the top of the container.
7. Entries will be disqualified for the following reasons: misnamed, improperly named roses, misclassed, misplaced (unless misplaced by the Entries Committee), unlabeled or mislabeled, stem-on-stem (Exception: Old Garden Roses and Shrubs), foreign substance, not disbudded when required, and violation of ARS or local society show rules.
8. Judging will be according to the ARS "Guidelines for Judging Roses" and performed by ARS-Accredited Rose Judges and apprentices. The ARS point scoring system, shown below, will be used for judging specimens. For Challenge Classes, an additional ten (10) points per specimen will be added for overall appearance of the collection.

## DIVISION II - ROSE ARRANGEMENTS RULES

By entering this show given under the American Rose Society rules, exhibitors agree to abide by the following rules. Contact JoAnn Brehm at 627-0577 for more information.

1. Arrangement exhibitors can place their own entries between $7: 30$ and 10:00 A.M. The Arrangement Placement Committee will assist in the specific placement of arrangements and measure mini arrangements for size conformance. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement, however, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the Committee may carefully move an arrangement.
2. All roses must be outdoor garden-grown and of high quality.
3. The rose(s) must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
4. Correct names of all roses in each arrangement should be written on the entry tag. Points will be deducted if rose(s) are unnamed or misnamed.
5. To be eligible for an ARS medal certificate, roses must be outdoor arranger grown, must be a first place winner scoring 92 points or more, have "AG" or "arranger grown" written on the entry tag, and must have the correct names of the roses written on the entry tag.
6. ONE entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired.
7. Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule. Flowers other than roses, and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
8. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title.
9. An arrangement incorrectly placed in one class when it should have been in another will be judged in the class in which it was placed.
10. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
11. Miniature arrangements will be displayed on small pedestals provided by the Tri-City Rose Society and judged at eye level.
12. Judging will be according to the ARS "Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements," by ARS-accredited rose arrangement judges and apprentices and/or accredited garden club arrangement judges, using an ARS scorecard for judging rose arrangements.
Infringement of the following rules will result in severe penalty of an arrangement.
13. Painted or dyed fresh plant materials, and live creatures are not allowed.
14. The use of plant materials on state or local conservation lists is not permitted.
15. The American flag or flag of any country may not be used in an arrangement or as a decoration in any way.
Infringement of the following rules will result in disqualification of an arrangement.
16. Roses not outdoor grown.
17. Use of artificial plant material.

NOTE: No American or other country flag permitted. Specific-color roses, named roses, or rose types not required, except where noted.

## ARS Medal Arrangement Certificates

ARS Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medal Arrangement Certificates may be awarded to the highest scoring arrangements from Classes $1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,10 \& 22$ if eligibility requirements are met.
ARS Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medal Miniature Arrangement Certificates may be awarded to the highest scoring arrangements from Classes $12,13,14,15,16, \& 17$ if eligibility requirements are met.
Eligibility requirements for both standard and miniature arrangements are:

1. Roses in the arrangement must be outdoor arranger-grown.
2. Design must be first place ribbon winner scoring 92 points or more.
3. The designation "arranger grown" or $\mathrm{AAG} \cong$ must be on the entry tag.
4. Correct names of the rose(s) must be written on the entry tag.

NOTE: All ARS Awards awarded to first place winner with 92 points or more, local awards require only 90 points or more.

Class 1 Indian Summer Mass design.
Class 2 Tornado Alley Line design.
Class 3 Hurricane Line-mass design.
ARS ROYALTY AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST TRADITIONAL ARRANGEMENT (ARS Royalty Award winner, if awarded.) The DR. KIRKLAND FRITZ MEMORIAL TROPHY donated by Winona and Lars Edvalson and prize from Jane Melville.

## DIVISION II - ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

SECTION B - MODERN CREATIVEIABSTRACT ARRANGEMENTS
Class 4 Stormy Weather Modern creative design, designer's choice of design components.
Class 5 Flash Flood Abstract design, designer's choice of design components, but abstraction dominant.

ARS ARTIST=S AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST MODERN CREATIVEIABSTRACT ARRANGEMENT (ARS Artist's Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from JoAnn Brehm in memory of Ruth Mickelson.

## SECTION C - ARRANGEMENTS IN THE ORIENTAL MANNER.

Class 6 Tsunami Design in the Oriental Manner using a low container (Moribana).
Class 7 Trade Winds Design in the Oriental Manner using a tall container (Nageire). Class 8 Typhoon Design in the Oriental Free Style Manner.
ARS ORIENTAL AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST ARRANGEMENT IN THE ORIENTAL MANNER (ARS Oriental Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from Lorraine and Don Doyle.

## SECTION D - CORSAGES AND NOSEGAYS

No dried or treated plant materials allowed. Provide own unobtrusive staging. Covered ice packs may be used.

Class 9 Rain, Rain, Go Away Corsage or Nosegay using fresh roses. Other fresh flowers, fresh plant material, doilies, hankies, and ribbons may be used. Corsage to be worn for adornment. Nosegay to be carried in hand.

BEST CORSAGE OR NOSEGAY Prize from Helen Newman.

## SECTION E - NOVICE ARRANGEMENTS

Open to arrangers who have never won an arrangement trophy or ARS Award, but may have won up to six first place ribbons in arrangement competition in an ARS show. Roses must be outdoor garden-grown, but not necessarily arranger-grown. The American flag is not permitted for use.

Class 10 Snow Flurries Designer's choice of style using standard-size roses.

BEST NOVICE ARRANGEMENT Prize from Rhoda Lewis.

## DIVISION II - ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

## SECTION F - JUDGE'S ARRANGEMENTS

This section is open only to arrangement judges who are judging the other arrangement sections of this show. These judges may not enter any other section in Division II. This section will be judged by Tri-City Rose Society ARS-accredited rose arrangement judges who may not enter in this section, but are allowed to enter all other sections in Division II.

Class 11 Raindrops on Roses Designer's choice of style using standard-size roses.
BEST JUDGE'S ENTRY Prize from JoAnn Brehm.

## SECTION G - TRADITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS USING MINIATURE/ MINI-FLORA ROSES

Class 12 Spring Showers Small Mass design, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.
Class 13 Thunder and Lightening Miniature Line design, not to exceed 5 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.

ARS MINI-ROYALTY AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST TRADITIONAL ARRANGEMENT USING MINIATURE/MINI-FLORA ROSES
(ARS Mini-Royalty Award winner, if awarded.) The WASHINGTON MUTUAL SAVINGS BANK TROPHY and prize from The Bryant Family.

## SECTION H - MODERN CREATIVE ARRANGEMENTS USING MINIATURE/MINIFLORA ROSES

Class 14 Northern Lights Small modern creative design, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.
Class 15 Wind Shear Miniature modern creative design, not to exceed 5 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.

ARS MINI-ARTIST=S AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST MODERN CREATIVE ARRANGEMENT USING MINIATURE/MINI-FLORA
ROSES (ARS Mini-Artist's Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from JoAnn Brehm.

## DIVISION II - ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

## SECTION I - ARRANGEMENTS IN THE ORIENTAL MANNER USING MINIATURE/MINI-FLORA ROSES

Class 16 Crescent Moon Small design in the Oriental Manner using a tall container, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.
Class 17 Blue Moon Miniature design in the Oriental Manner using a low container, not to exceed 5 inches in height, width, or depth, including container, base, and accessories.

ARS MINI-ORIENTAL AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or more.
BEST ARRANGEMENT IN THE ORIENTAL MANNER USING MINIATURE/MINI-
FLORA ROSES (ARS Mini-Oriental Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from Dorothy and Jim Campbell.

## SECTION J - ROSECRAFTS USING DRIED ROSES

A design using dried roses (any size rose) as dominant factor. Natural dried materials may be used, such as dried or treated foliage, cones, pods, and ribbons or bows.

Class 18 Chinook Winds Door or Wall Hangings, Wreaths
Class 19 Santa Ana Winds Pictures, Picture Frames, Plaques. Corsages, Potpourri, Jewelry, etc.

ARS ROSECRAFT AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or higher.
BEST ROSECRAFT (ARS Rosecraft Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from Linda and Richard Kerkof.

## SECTION K - MINIATURE ARRANGEMENTS USING DRIED ROSES

An arrangement using dried miniature and/or mini-flora roses, with or without dried and/or treated rose foliage, and/or other dried natural plant materials. Contrived flowers made from natural dried plant material may also be used. Roses must predominate. No plastic, paraffin-dipped, or artificial plant material is allowed. Arrangement must be in a suitable container.

Class 20 Balmy Breezes Small Mass design, not to exceed 10 inches in height, width, or depth, including container and base, and accessories.
Class 21 Global Warming Designer's choice of style, not to exceed 5 inches in height, width, or depth, including container and base, and accessories.

ARS MINI-KEEPSAKE AWARD Roses must be CORRECTLY IDENTIFIED on the entry tag, but need not be arranger-grown. Awarded to highest scoring first place winner with 92 points or higher.

## DIVISION II - ROSE ARRANGEMENTS

## SECTION L - JUNIOR ARRANGEMENTS

An arrangement created by individuals age 17 years and under. The word "Junior" should be written on the entry tag. Roses must be outdoor, garden-grown, but need not be arranger-grown. The American flag is not permitted for use.

Class 22 El NiZo Designer's choice of style using standard-size roses.
BEST JUNIOR ARRANGEMENT (ARS Junior Arrangement Award winner, if awarded.) Prize from Norma Boswell.
